## Responding to Hurricane Sandy's Effects on New York City

Like you, the members of the Outreach Team are saddened to see the damage caused in New York and beyond. We are sending money to help the people served by [Rauschenbusch Metro Ministries](#). Jeff Langill, Rev. Marie Lucca, and high school youth group members served at this organization in February of this year.

Rauschenbusch Metro Ministries offers help to homeless and struggling families in the Hell's Kitchen neighborhood. Services include a food pantry, a clothing closet, and ESL (English as a Second Language) classes. Their [Hell's Kitchen Teen Center](#) provides a safe, inclusive space for teenagers, a place to gather for enrichment and educational opportunities after school. In the aftermath of this terrible storm, it feels important to help the Teen Center continue to provide this safe haven.

Your gift of a Community Animal Health Worker Kit can include a stethoscope, a thermometer, medicine, disinfectant, and gloves, as well as training.



- **Start a Women's Self-Help Group** — Solutions to hunger and poverty require that women be engaged in the process of lifting their communities. In many areas of the world, literacy rates among women are low. Your gift will help women start a self-help group where they can learn to read. They will also receive the livestock and training that will empower them to reduce their vulnerability to domestic violence, trafficking, and health-related issues.
