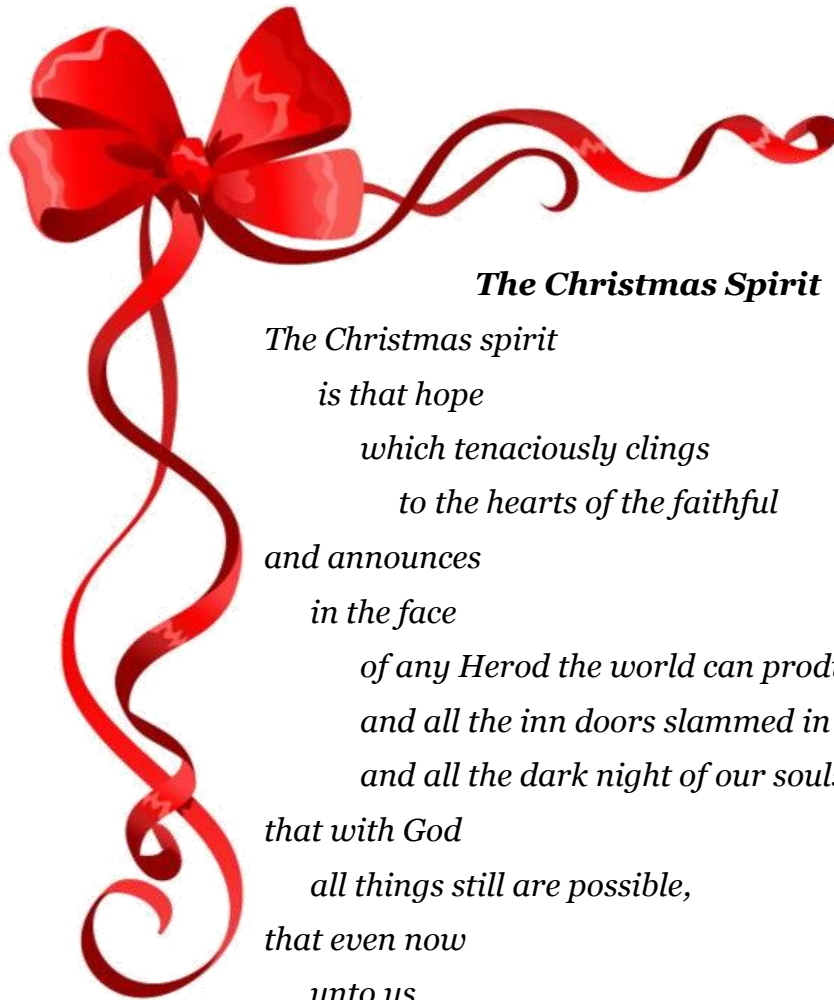

### Fair Trade Shopping



Thank you to everyone who ordered Equal Exchange goods during our sale. We were happy to spread the word about how sustainable farming and buying “Fair Trade” helps to support small farmers, sustainable farming and support healthy families around the world. They say eating dark chocolate is good for your heart. Buying these organic Fair Trade chocolates is also good for your soul! We still have some dark and milk chocolates available for cash and carry sales at just \$8 for a bag of 30 mini-bars. ## A Christmas Letter

Good People of Centre Church,

One of the most important ways that I hear God's voice is through music, and I know that I am not alone in that. Music soothes, challenges, hopes, swells, and carries all possible emotion. And this year, as we read through Advent and Christmas in the Gospel of Luke, we are treated to some of the most beautiful hymns in scripture. In Luke we find both Zechariah's Song and Mary's Song and we hear the Angels singing to the shepherds.

I have long been drawn to Mary. I have dreamed of her, prayed with her, wept with her. I have visited the Church of the Visitation that stands on the supposed ground where Zechariah and Elizabeth lived and where Mary visited, pregnant with our Savior; the place where she sang her beautiful hymn of praise for what God has done for her and what God will do through her. Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1:46b-55) carries echoes of the song Hannah, the mother of the prophet Samuel, sang in thanksgiving as she relinquished her son to minister to the Lord, in the presence of the priest Eli. Hannah's song (1 Samuel 2:1-10) is thought to have been added into the story of Samuel by the biblical editors and dates to at least the time of King David. It is also probable that it predated that time in some form in the oral tradition of ancient Hebrew worship. Thinking of Mary singing a well-known hymn at a time of profound activity in her life actually rings true for me. And singing it each Christmas connects us in time and across time to all of God's people and to the truth of God's holy and saving love born into the world through a poor, young woman from Nazareth.

There is a beautiful song by the Wailin' Jennys called *One Voice*. This year the USAF Band performed it for the holiday season as a reminder of the power of unity. In it I hear Hannah and Mary, boldly singing their song of God's love and justice in the midst of their own fear and awe. In it I hear you and me, singing in the midst of our own time and the knowledge of the joys and sorrows of our own lives. In it I hear all of us singing with all people who recognize that together we magnify the light and love of the God of ALL!

It is our faithful response modeled after Hannah and Mary and all who sang before us. It is our hopeful practice to pass these songs on to those who will come after us. One people, one voice!
