FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT: Pentecost

When was the last time that you felt filled with the Spirit?

Graduations this time of year can fill us with lots of spirit. A new job, a wedding, birthdays, the anticipation of going off on summer vacation.

Some of the times that I have felt filled with the spirit have been:

- In High School, when, as a drummer, my band was going to play for the High School Dance.
- ▲ The anticipation of getting my first car.
- ▲ Graduations from High School, College, Graduate School.
- The news that I was being offered the chance to be pastor of each of the three churches that I have now served. On one of these occasions, I stopped my car, got out, and danced on the side of the road so that I could fully realize and express my excited spirit.

Of course, there are many, many more.

Spiritually, we have times that are filled with the Spirit. On the occasion of **Pentecost**, "The Birthday of the Church," celebrated this Sunday, June 12th, we remember how the Spirit has been active in our history, and pray for its continued activity in our lives.

The brief history of Pentecost: It means fiftieth day (now, the 50th day after Easter). It was the second of three great Jewish Feasts. It was a day of gratitude. It was a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest.

After Jesus ascended into heaven he appeared again, on Pentecost, in a little room somewhere in Jerusalem where people from every nation had gathered to celebrate their harvest. Suddenly, the Spirit of God (Holy Spirit) filled the room allowing people from every nation to be able to speak and understand each other. Even though they were there with different intentions and motives, they were now able to understand each other, and work together to fulfill God's will.

This is one of the most exciting, spirit-filled things about the church that I love. We come together

from different places, with different intentions, motives, and find a way of working together through the power of the Spirit of God, or Holy Spirit. We listen to each other, we respect each other, we visit each other, we endure together, we sweat and pray together, celebrate together, and build a common experience of faith out of our many different backgrounds, beliefs, and experiences.

great joy how the Spirit can help us lower our boundaries, put aside our egos, spiritual and otherwise, to work together for the common good of God's intentions for us.

As I think about the upcoming tenth anniversary of 911, it is my hope and my prayer, that our community of Lynnfield will be guided by this Pentecostal Spirit to work together to serve to remember those innocents and heroes who died that day. We remember them, their acts of heroism, their lives, their dreams, how they served us in life and how memories of them continue to inspire and serve us today and for years to come.

We plan for our community on Sunday, September 11, 2011:

- 1) 8:30 am a brief remembrance in front of Fire Headquarters around the time American Airlines Flight #11, flying from Boston to Los Angeles, CA, hit the WTC, killing all 92 passengers and crew on board.
- 2) 3 pm to 7 pm, a reading of the 911 names remembrance on Lynnfield Town Common, reading and remembering all 3,000 plus people who died that day. If you would like to participate in the reading of some of the names, please send me your name, phone, and email.
- **3) 7 pm: a service of remembrance**, with music, speaker, Katherine Bailey, wife of the late Garnet "Ace" Bailey, who died on United Airlines Flight #175 when it hit the WTC, and prayers.

If you would like to participate and support these remembrances you may contact me via email, phone, letter. You may provide financial support by writing a check to: "Lynnfield 911," and send it to: Centre Church, c/o Rev. Dennis Bailey, 5 Summer Street, Lynnfield, MA 01940. The Savings Bank has created a special account for us to use to cover the expenses of this event and the Lynnfield Rotary has already donated funds as a show of support.

I am convening a Lynnfield 911 Committee and the Lynnfield Clergy to work together, under God's Spirit, to plan and guide these special remembrances.

In Pentecost we recognize how God's Spirit moves among us to unite us, empower us, and to make us stronger. In remembering those who have gone before us, as we do in remembrances of 911, we remember their powerful spirits, and continue to feel their presence and strength.

And, in recognizing and remembering, God's Spirit fills us again, to move us to still greater purposes, greater things, in the work of God.

I pray God's Spirit is with you now and tomorrow, and that you will use that Spirit to work together with others of us to make God known and to fulfill God's intentions for us, the people of faith.
