The Wisdom of Proverbs

Many years ago I had a parishioner who had been a highly respected and regarded teacher in the town of Billerica. She was loving and kind. On the occasion of her funeral, I decided to turn to the Book of Proverbs and found appropriate scriptural remembrances of what she represented.

I share some of the treasures from this precious, but, also, very interesting book of the Bible. If you dare to read it, I caution you, some of what you read may shock you while other verses will be like these that I share below.

For me, I treasure these verses of scripture because they remind me of how to find true wealth in life. I know that we spend a lot of time and energy focusing on making money, putting away enough to live on when we can hopefully afford to retire. But, I have learned time and time again, and through some particularly close friends, that the more we give, the more we receive.

I believe that it is important to focus on getting things, getting the right things. The most valuable things that I have received cannot be put in my wallet or my bank account. I treasure most my friendships where I find the wealth noted in these verses of scripture.

For the LORD gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding. (Proverbs 2:6)

Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. (Proverbs 3:3)

Together We Can Make a Difference

As I write this article it is a balmy 46 degrees outside. When we get a day like this, I tend to think that the worst of the weather is behind us. Silly me. On the TV just now the forecast for tomorrow and next few days will be 19-26 degrees, Okay back to reality. The cold, freezing temperatures make me so grateful to have all that is needed to stay warm and comfortable inside. I believe all of you are just as blessed as I am in this regard.

Unfortunately, there are so many people who are homeless, hungry and in shelters. There are two local organizations that are offering services to these people in need.

My Brother's Table is a wonderful place in Lynn that has been serving free meals to our hungry neighbors 365 days a year for over three decades now. The Table is completely privately funded in order to serve the greatest number of guests. They do not use or seek any funding from the government. They welcome all.

The Emergency Shelter which is part of the Lynn Shelter Association is another caring and much needed organization in Lynn. Over 50 people are housed there nightly and in the winter, the numbers swell to 70-80 a night. The past couple of months have been so frigid that they have even put up chairs so that more people can have a warm and safe place to stay for the night.

My Brothers Table and the Emergency Shelter in Lynn are in immediate need of specific items.

Your support and compassion would be gratefully appreciated. Even if each person brought only one item, we would still be able to help so many people. Thank you very much. -Donna Marino
