Thanksgiving

On the living room wall of my brother and sister-in-law's home are these scriptural words, "In Everything Give Thanks." They come from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 which reads, "*Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.*"

I know it is hard for us to always give thanks. I know this from my own experience because not every day is a happy day. Not every season in my life has been one filled with rejoicing. And yet, here in this scripture, the Apostle Paul, who suffered much on behalf of his testimony of faith, exhorts us to always give thanks.

All throughout scripture we see the powerful theme of thanksgiving.

Here are some examples (New Revised Standard Version Translation):

O give thanks to the LORD, call on his name, make known his deeds among the peoples. (1 Chronicles 16:8)

I will give to the LORD the thanks due to his righteousness, and sing praise to the name of the LORD, the Most High. (*Psalm 7:17*)

Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him, bless his name. (*Psalm 100:4*)

Praise the LORD! O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. (*Psalm 106:1*)

You will say in that day: I will give thanks to you, O LORD, for though you were angry with me, your anger turned away, and you comforted me. *(Isaiah 12:1)*

Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. (*John 6:11*)

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus.... (1 Corinthians 1:4)

I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. *(Ephesians 1:16)*

Bailey Nursery in Room 11 (ages 5 & under) Older Children in Church When I find myself in the midst of trouble, suffering, grief, and difficulty, I find these things become easier if I continue to give thanks to God for the blessings in my life, for how God has guided and directed me, and for the large number of friends who have walked with me to support and love me through my times of challenge and darkness. I find the doors to new life open easier and the periods of sadness and sorrow become shorter in duration.

I also find that if I carry with me a thankful heart each day, people around me find it easier to connect with me. If I greet people with words like, "It is so good to see you," showing them how grateful I am for them in my life, even if I am sad, they find it easier to lend me their support, and therefore, lift me to new joy.

I am grateful that Thanksgiving is a national holiday, but its roots are deeply embedded in our spiritual traditions, brought to this country by our fore bearers. It is a spiritual action to give thanks to God for family, for friends, for each day, each meal, each drink of clean water, and each breath of life. And, it is important that we give thanks to our families and friends for all of their love.

I invite you to join me in this spiritual tradition this Thanksgiving and all year round. Look your family and friends in the eye and tell them, "*I am thankful to God that you are in my life and I am thankful for the joy you bring to me.*" Now, that said, if your emotions are anything like mine, it might be hard to get it all out before tears punctuate the sentence. But, just as Jesus wept for his friends, so, let us use words, tears, emotions, laughter to speak of our gratitude!

And so, now, to all of you who are reading this, "I am thankful to God that you are reading this. I am thankful to God that you are in my life because you are a blessing to me. I am thankful to God for you who are my family and my friends. I am thankful to God for the opportunity to serve as pastor at Centre Congregational Church, Lynnfield, and for those who support its ministry. And I am thankful to God for my wonderful life."
