Postlude

Today I find myself reflecting on how special each and every person is, how we are all among God's chosen. If you are like me, you see or experience certain persons as "chosen" for God's work in a special way. I have had people who were my mentors in my journey of faith. They impressed me as understanding how God works and calls us to discipleship. They taught me to not be like them, but, to find my own path, the things within me that are special, and to allow them to help guide me to how my life and career would develop.

My mentors also taught me to trust the Spirit of God to direct me at the right time and place. I learned, to some degree, to trust that if God wanted me to be something, to do something, and/or to go somewhere, that I would find a way for it to happen, even if I didn't think it possible. Most of the time, in my life, there have been two things perceived by me as barriers to going where I felt God wanted me to go: money and ability.

I often felt, "how on earth can I do that? I don't have the money." I also often felt that if I did have the money, I didn't have the ability to do and be what God was asking of me.

My lesson for today is this: Do not let earthly and human concerns block us from doing what God is asking of us. See with God's eyes. Believe with God's heart. We are all God's chosen people. It is up to each of us, and

all of us together, to choose to be what God has chosen us to be.

On Christmas Eve, at the 5 pm service, I saw at least 6 people choose to be God's chosen people: Becca Sievers, Dotty Whittier, Camille Hodgkins, Sonia Kuhls (a high school exchange student from Germany), Julia Seelig, and Maggie Weaver. They ranged in age from Middle School, High School, to an adult who is a teacher. They each played a unique and special role in the service, singing, speaking, or playing the guitar.
