"Uncovering"

Jesus once said: "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

I look out my window and see the beginning of the "uncovering." In the places and pathways, and on some roofs, where we have been clearing away the snow, the temperatures and sun have melted away the remainder. We see grass, bare walkways, driveways and roof tops.

In some of these cases the "uncovering" has come as the result of hard work, back breaking work, while in other cases it has been done by snowplows, snow blowers, chemicals, contractors, neighbors, or friends.

I think of this in the season of Lent, in particular, because it is during this time that we are invited to "uncover" the spiritual places in our lives that have become covered over, out of sight, hidden beneath other things.

It makes me wonder. Have our spiritual ties become covered with "storms" of suffering, work, time, neglect? Do we need and/or desire to uncover and rediscover the places and things of meaning in our lives that once gave us hope, dreams, idealism, and inspiration? Have we intentionally covered the "light" that God has given to us, not allowing it to be a blessing in the lives of others?

I know that when things change in our lives, sometimes our spiritual connections also change, break, and become covered over. It could be that what was once comfortable and meaningful was broken due to a change in persons through whom we found spiritual meaning, and/or through unpleasant conflicts that pushed us away.

I write this to you today, to invite you to "uncover," to try again to reconnect with God's presence, and to open your heart, mind, and spirit to God's light. As the snow melts outside to reveal pathways that you can once again walk, may that which has covered over the once important spiritual pathways in your life also melt away, allowing you to once again, find your way to God's light.

May you also "uncover" your light and discover pathways through which you can share the light that God has generously given to you, so as to be a blessing to others. I know that many of you feel that your light has little or nothing to offer, but, I find that once we reconnect to the spiritual energy of God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and God's people, we are pleasantly surprised that we have more of God's light to share than we ever imagined!
