A Different Kind of "20 Questions"...

The purpose of the game is to guess the answer by asking up to 20 questions.

I need your help to illustrate a point. If you wear glasses, please take them off for a moment and look around, noticing what you see, then put them back on. If you don't wear glasses, look at something in the distance, then walk over to it and look at it up close. Was there a difference in your perspective? Did things that were unclear come into focus? Did you see the same object in a different way? In many instances in the Bible, Jesus invites a new perspective and I'm going to do so today, as it applies to this beautiful and beloved church.

The next time you come to church, please pretend it's your first time here. Take the time to look closely, with a new perspective. What do you see today? Who do you see today? Are we meeting the needs of those who are here? Who isn't here? Who are our neighbors? What is God calling us to do in this time and place?

If you always use the parking lot entrance, why not try coming in the front doors to see what that experience is like? If you aren't able to come to worship, how does the church serve your needs and how might you be able to be involved with this church community?

How often do you participate in the offerings in the narthex (foyer)? Is the worship experience meaningful for you? If you've been here a while, do you have questions about anything we do at Centre Church? If you're new, what questions do you have? Where might you like to get more involved? What can Centre Church do to offer a safe and sacred space in which people can learn and share and grow in faith? While Sunday worship is the pinnacle of our week together, church has never really been a 'one day a week activity'. Since it's unlikely that our weekends will get any less busy or that sporting events will cease to be held on Sundays, in addition to worship, what can we do to reach people? What would you invite a friend to? Do you talk about your faith?

Centre Church does so much good in the world and we have so much to offer! We have excellent engagement in volunteer work, phenomenal children's programming, an outstanding choir, diverse faith and fellowship activities, and truly dedicated people in our midst. How can we share this good news and continue the upward trajectory of all of our offerings?

I lift up these questions now as we formally begin the transition work that will lead you to your next settled pastor. Part of my role as your Interim Pastor is to be reflecting back to the church what I observe. This is your church and your voices matter so I invite and encourage your engagement in the transition process.

All of the questions lead to <u>the overarching</u> <u>'answer' to the issues of this world: vital and vibrant</u> <u>church community!</u> Please join us for the congregational meeting on April 3rd and please save the date of May 1 for the next congregational meeting with Associate Conference Minister Wendy Vander Hart.
