We Welcome Everyone: An "Open and Affirming" Church

September 21, 2016

Q: "Pete and Repeat were in a boat. Pete fell out. Who's left?" A: "Repeat!". Q: "Pete and Repeat were in a boat. Pete fell out. Who's left?"

Did you ever play this game as a child? It's a silly play on words that keeps you trapped in a cycle of repeating the same words, usually to the mounting frustration of the person giving the answers (and unknowingly inviting the same behavior over and over again). It exemplifies a pattern that keeps us attached to others.

In life, some people (and often the ones closest to us) know just how to push our buttons. They know exactly what to say to get a particular response from us. But the game only works as long as you play along. Once your anticipated response doesn't occur, the game ends. For example: Q: "Pete and Repeat were in a boat. Pete fell out. Who's left?" A: "The other person."

When the response changes, the interaction changes and the game is over. Could it be that easy to stop negative attachment?

If we reflect back in our own lives to times that we've been angry or frustrated, we can often see that those emotions stem from feelings of pain. We've been overlooked or unappreciated or feel as though someone has taken advantage of us. Hurt and anger are two sides of the same coin.

When we're in pain and we let anger build, we're building a connection to our perpetrators and we're giving them control over us, thereby compounding their interest and our pain. By holding on to that anger or frustration, we are essentially saying "repeat" because we're carrying something from the past into the present. We can choose whether to react from a place of anger or from a place of love.

We can choose to let Love be our guiding star. First John chapter 4, tells us that God is love. Whoever doesn't know love doesn't know God. And when we love one another, God lives in us. We can choose to let God live in us and have God's goodness influence our behavior. We can choose to employ compassion, sympathy, patience, and ultimately forgiveness. And we can rid ourselves of negative attachments, transforming ourselves and others in the process.

Ministry Moment - Outreach

We consistently support Our Church's Wider Mission, the charitable arm of the United Church of Christ ministering to those in need around the globe. Then, on a case by case basis, we donate to other local and global charities.

But it's not all about money! We help others in our community and around the world with our time and talents as well as our funds. It's also not all about the Outreach Team, as we support the charitable efforts of many other church teams.

For instance, the supplies for our monthly Bread and Roses meal are funded by your Missions money, but the meal is prepared by a small church team who devote themselves to this hands-on ministry. Our Youth Groups organize many giving opportunities for us, such as the Souper Bowl of Caring, the Heifer Marketplace, the Thanksgiving turkey drive, clothes drives and mission trips. The whole congregation is welcome to drop off redeemable bottles and cans as well as food, in the Missions Pantry. These collections as well as the turkey drive, benefit Haven From Hunger. And of course, every week the goat tube is available in the Narthex. Each time this tube is filled with quarters, our congregation can donate another goat through Heifer International.
