#### A View from the Bridge

From the Pastor

Lately I have pondered the subject of assumptions — I do from time to time — and the arenas in which assumptions can be made are many.

What happens when we assume:

- that all family members will want to do the same thing?
- that our word to a legislator won't make a difference?
- that the puppy we bought will always be cared for by the kids?
- that other people will pledge enough to support our life and work as a church, so we don't have to think about it?
- that a long list of accomplishments and activities is essential to our children's futures?
- that other friends will visit the person in the hospital, the nursing home, the prison?
- that the suit bought in view of weight to be lost will be worn in this lifetime?
- that our spouse or partner or children know that we love them?
- that family will know what to do without our creating a will?
- that good health is a given without our looking after it?
- that others know by our silence we disapprove of their actions?
- that weather for an outdoor event in New England will be sunny?
- that the work to prevent violence is best left only to a few community folk volunteering to explore it?
- that town meetings are really best left to the dedicated regulars?
- that our children will learn all they need to know about faith from Sunday School?
- that we don't have time to nurture our own Christian faith on a regular basis in communal worship and study year round?
- that we can't give up anything to read with our kids?
- that we can't give up anything to talk with our spouse or partner?
- that we can't set aside even five minutes let alone fifteen for silent, peaceful prayer or meditation or reflection (without creating a to-do list) each day?

I've made many of these assumptions at different times in my life. I'm willing to venture that you have, too. Summer is such a good time for growing things: maybe summer will be a good time to carry out some personal inventory to grow beyond our assumptions. May it be a fruitful season.
