What Shall We Bring?

By the time you read this, our Stewardship Season will have begun at Centre Church. As you have read and heard before, our theme is, "What Shall We Bring?" and we will be reflecting on the different types of gifts that we bring: gifts of love, gifts of word and deed, gifts of presence, and gifts of faithfulness. Ultimately, all of these gifts added together will reflect what we learned to give from Paul when we began our new church year together. What shall we bring? Our whole selves! Even, perhaps, the gift that you've been hiding, or hiding from. We are each called to name our gifts and to claim them, for they have been given to us by God, not to be ignored or denied, but shared.

But, you may be wondering, what if I don't know what my gifts are? What if I'm unsure of a) whether this "thing" I can do, or this "thing" I have can be useful, or b) what percentage of my financial gifts I can afford to give? I believe the way to answer your own inner questions is with two interlocking spiritual practices that enhance everything we do. I've been mentioning them both because God keeps drawing my attention to them...and I have (finally) woken up and devoted myself to both. The first is **presence** and the second is **gratitude**.

To cultivate presence, there is the title of an off-Broadway play that Father Greg Boyle turned into a motto. "Now. Here. This." When you're struggling to know what your gifts are, paying attention to the present moment can be the first step of revealing them, admitting them to

yourself. And gratitude, really developing a practice of gratitude, can turn your whole outlook around. This has to be intentional, daily, and written down. Find yourself a little notebook, a scrap piece of paper, anything, and each day, write down what you're grateful for. Something. Anything. Even on the worst days, I promise you there is something to be grateful for. And if you work on staying present to each moment and cultivating gratitude in your life, the task of discerning what you'll bring to our worship and ministries here at Centre Church will be lifegiving, not only to the church, but to YOU!

Young Families Group:

We are planning a Family Ice Skating Family Event for February or March -- more details to come!

April: We will "Light it Up Blue" in April for Autism Awareness. Our church will have blue lights for the month beginning on April 1st. We may also host an event during the month, but we need a few volunteers to help put this together.

Giv2/Older Youth

There was a meeting of the Giv2 Leadership Committee on January 29th.

We are planning to continue with our church's connection to City Reach/Common Cathedral via the Giv2 Ecumenical Group. On March 8-9th, our middle and high school students will have an opportunity to become more educated on the issue of homelessness with an overnight in Boston. CityReach is an overnight urban outreach program begun in March 1996 for youth (with accompanying adults), young adults, and college students from churches of any denomination. The program gives these young people the opportunity to learn first hand about homelessness from people who have experienced it. During the 20 hour session, participants join CityReach staff in street ministry and offer hospitality, food and clothing. This is followed by times of sharing and reflection.

The program starts on Friday evening and ends on the following Saturday afternoon. Participants arrive at 7 p.m. Friday night, and are addressed by staff who are experiencing, or have experienced, homelessness. They walk through the city guided by members of *common cathedral* and end the evening with a simple worship service. Participants sleep at a local church. On Saturday morning participants offer clothing that

they have collected and a simple meal to unhoused guests who come to "shop" for clothing from among the donated items. Participants form teams for street outreach, taking sandwiches and clothes to people at South Station, Copley Square, Boston's waterfront and other sites. All then eat lunch and reflect together about their experiences in light of the Gospel, write a prayer, and talk about next steps for them personally and/or as a group. Adult chaperones welcome. We will be collecting adult sized underwear and socks and bringing them with us to Boston. The cost is approximately \$75/per person, but we have money in our Youth Mission Budget to help with the cost.
