Letters to Myself

In order to get to my point today, I must begin with a confession. I watch *Survivor*. The producers of the show are forever tampering with this game/social experiment and there was a moment in this week's episode that connected to a thread that I've just been pulling on. Let me explain:

As I was thinking about what I wanted to say to you, I was reading a wide variety of reflections by others to see if any sparks went off for me. When I was still staring at a blank word document, I decided to go back and visit my younger self in my own writing. As I perused files of sermon thoughts, spiritual reflections, etc. from my time in seminary and student ministry, I opened one document titled "farewell reflection." It was the final reflection I wrote to Rev. Dana Allen Walsh as my supervisor at the end of my first year of student ministry. It also happened to be on the occasion of her leaving Hancock Church to become Senior Pastor of South Church in Andover. What struck me most is what always strikes me when I look back: the collapsing of time. As I read, it felt like forever ago and only a breath in the past, all at the same time! Here we are, 5 years later and I am now a settled pastor and I live less than a mile from the church that Dana was called to.

So, back to Survivor. Some of the contestants were given letters they wrote to themselves before the game began. In their own writing, time collapsed and their own words were a balm to their game-weary selves and exactly the encouragement they needed to continue. While I didn't write my final reflection to Dana as a letter to myself, it ended up functioning in that way this morning. And in the simple act of reading it, I received the gift of Kairos, of God's time, which is circular, sacred, and for me, hopeful. It helps me tap into the holy truth that God's ways are not our ways. It helps me trust in, as Pierre Teilhard de Chardin calls it, "the slow work of God." It helps me to notice this precious moment but not cling to it too tightly, because if I cling, I'll miss what God is up to next.

Over the coming 18 months, we as Centre Church will be engaging in the process of reflecting on our past, engaging with the present, and anticipating our future. We'll seek and find the letters we wrote to ourselves over 300 years. I hope there will be many "kairos moments" when we will see the threads of our common life and maybe even catch a glimpse of the great circle they are weaving on God's time.


