And just like that, we're off. Another year has begun. Last Sunday, we welcomed everyone to a new year. In worship we blessed backpacks, work bags, and hiking packs. Our choir once again enriched our worship experience. Our children went off to three different age-specific programs to engage with the stories of our faith. Our youngest ones were welcomed into our transformed nursery space in Room 10. And after worship, we had a time of fellowship, catching up with each other, and meeting those who joined us for the first time.

On Sunday evening, September 22, the Lynnfield Community came together to offer support to those impacted by substance use. We together, listened together. walked and participated in a lighting ceremony together, to share hope and strength in community. Because, as my friend the Rev. Sandi Albom says, "Community is a healing thing. Isolation feeds addiction. Community leads us away from addiction." Rev. Albom is an Episcopal Priest and she leads the Recovery Ministry of the Episcopal Church of NH. Recovery from substance use is not the only struggle that can be positively impacted by accompaniment, by the unconditional love and acceptance found within a community committed to radical welcome, inclusion, and companionship. Substance use and the anxiety, depression, and trauma that can lead to substance use, are but a few of the "potholes" that cause our lives to unravel.

Sometimes, when life shakes us, blinds us, stops us on our path, when we fall into potholes created by others or even of our own making..., Sometimes, when all of our plans come unraveled, God gives us others, often the most unlikely or those we don't even deserve, to lead us, welcome us, walk with us on a new path. As we begin this new year and begin to celebrate our 300th year, let's focus on all the ways we are accompanying one another; the ways we are already a community of intentional welcome and inclusion, AND the ways we are called to do better. Jesus shows us over and over how wide we are to draw the circle of God's healing love! Jesus sees. Jesus listens. Jesus includes. Jesus reaches out. Jesus pulls in. Jesus accompanies. Jesus loves. That we, The Centre Church in Lynnfield, might follow him, I pray.
