Caretakers of the Way

Humans leave traces of connection. The British naturalist Robert MacFarlane has written "that once you begin to notice them, you see that the landscape is still webbed with paths and footpaths Pilgrim paths, green roads, drove roads, corpse roads, trods, leys, dykes, drongs, sarns, snickets –say the names of paths out loud and at speed and they become a poem or rite – holloways, bostles, shutes, driftways, lichways, ridings, halterpaths, cartways, carneys, causeways, herepaths."

(Robert MacFarlane, The Old Ways, p. 13)

Faith too is a path of connection but unless the way is practiced it disappears. Stewardship is the practice that generates and regenerates the path of faith. Stewardship is less about sharpening our pencils and more about sharpening our tools for trail maintenance, equipping ourselves to be caretakers of the path connecting us to our Creator and guiding our steps.

Robert MacFarlane reports that in the 19th century small sickles were hung on stiles or posts where paths connecting communities began. Walkers would pick up the sickle or hook to lop off branches as they walked. They would then leave the 'hook' on the stile or post at the end of the path so a walker going in the opposite direction could do the same. This shared caretaking of the path benefited each individual walker but also the larger community.

The early Christian movement was known internally as well as to its persecutors as the way (Acts 9). The life of faith is a way of being human, a way of interpreting, a way of practicing, a way of living. In December, several of you found your way onto the labyrinth to pray with your feet. If only one of you had found meaning, then having the labyrinth would be worthwhile. But the story is even bigger than that. It turns out we are caretakers of the path that brought meaning to others as well. Individuals who were here for a meeting found their way onto the labyrinth. We didn't keep this amazing tool for ourselves, but instead shared it with all who wanted to connect to our Creator and find guidance on the way.

As we journey towards the reign of God, we are following in the tracks of others, ways walked by Jesus himself, paths as ancient as Abraham and Sarah. Today we are not just signposts pointing the way but the caretakers, the stewards of that way. Come and join in the way.

Tri p to the Holy Land

We are planning a tour of the Holy Land in celebration of the church's 300th birthday! In November 2020, we will fly to Israel for eight days where we will be led by Amir Or-ly, an amazing teacher and tour guide. The logistics of our trip are being handled by Keshet Educational Journeys, a well-known tour group that specializes in quality educational tour programs. This is an opportunity for your knowledge and understanding of the Hebrew and Christian scriptures to explode with all the layers of personal experience – the sights, tastes, sounds, and textures of the Holy Land.

Highlights of the tour include: Caesarea where St. Paul was arraigned before being sent to Rome for trial; Tiberias where we will stay on the shores of the Sea of Galilee and visit Capernaum, which was Jesus' home base for his ministry, the Mt. of Beatitudes where the Sermon on the Mount teachings were given, Nazareth, and more; Ein Gedi, where we will visit Masada, and Qumran to learn about the Dead Sea Scrolls; and then up to Jerusalem, where we will visit Mt. Zion, David's Tomb, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, and other important locations in Jewish and Christian history. All along the way, we will be learning about modern day life in Israel as well. This tour includes eight full days of travel and education with ample time for self-guided side outings and personal prayer and reflection. There is a fair amount of walking (up and down as well; not all surfaces are level) so if you really want to go but have concerns about your ability to participate in all the activities, let's talk.

We have a growing group of interested participants and would love for you to join us. Based on a tour group of 15-20 people the base fee for each participant will be less than \$3,000 not including airfare. Airfare adds another \$1,200 or so.
