Doing Justice, Loving Mercy, and Walking Humbly

Dear Centre Church,

Since some of you are unable to join us online for worship and/or receive and read our new email newsletter, I want to share some of the words I have spoken into this very tumultuous time we are living in. On June 4th, I participated in a Virtual Vigil for George Floyd hosted by the Town of Lynnfield and Lynnfield for Love. Here is some of what I said to all who gathered:

Welcome to everyone who is joining us tonight. I know that George Floyd's death and all that has happened since have deeply affected my spirit. I am grateful for this time together in which we can name our pain, our fear, our confusion, and our commitment, our solidarity, and ultimately our hope. My message for myself and for our community tonight is simple and at the same time, so obviously challenging. That message is #BlackLivesMatter. ALL BLACK LIVES MATTER! And here is why the reply to Black Lives Matter is not All Lives Matter. Because All Lives don't matter in our nation. But it feels like with George Floyd's death, a threshold has been crossed, far too late for our black communities, too late for George and Amaud, and Brionna, and so many more...but crossed nonetheless. People are done with their black and brown neighbors, their black and brown siblings, their black and brown children being murdered by the very ones sworn to protect them or by those whose hate has been sanctioned by our unjust systems and corrupt leaders. On the other side of that threshold, we are invited to hear the "too", the "also," when we hear #BlackLivesMatter. Black Lives Matter, too. Or in other words, All Lives WILL matter when Black Lives Matter. I say

this to you, very clear on who I am and who I am not. I am an ordained minister of word and sacrament in the United Church of Christ, whose faith teaches that each and every person is created in the image of God, loved by God, worthy and valuable. I am a Christian called to look at the world through the LOVE taught to us in the person and life of Jesus Christ. In addition to being a Christian pastor, I am a white, cisgendered, heterosexual, married woman, a mother of 3 adult children, and many other identifiers. What I am not though, clearly: I am not Black. I cannot begin to describe to you the experience of being black in this nation. But what I can do is listen to those who are living Black in America. I can center their stories. I can open my heart and mind to their experience and believe what they tell me. I can claim boldly that Black Lives Matter and show up intentionally against all the machinations of our society that value supremacy, superiority, or complacency. And I can invite you to join me. I am not perfect. I don't get it right all the time. I am still learning. And I want to offer you safe space to do the same. To ask questions, to learn alongside one another, to work for justice and peace alongside each other and in solidarity with our black citizens, neighbors, and friends.

Friends, we have work to do. We are called to do justice, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God. Whenever I find myself thinking, "But, what about..." or "But, I can't..." "But, I don't..." when confronted with my own privilege and with injustice, with the horror of someone else's story, I have started to ask myself, "What are you afraid of, Nancy?" Fear drives anger. Fear drives hatred. Fear is at the heart of any person or system seeking power over. And that fear is largely irrational and illconceived, built on lies. Lies that one group is superior to another. Built on bad theology that claims God loves me more than the other, or the other more than me. Built on misinformation and misdirection that exists to perpetuate the injustice that props up the few while disadvantaging the many.

Beloved, we have work to do. The work of educating ourselves. The work of leaning into really hard conversations. The work of standing with and for our neighbors of color, the poor, the mistreated. The good news is, Jesus, our redeemer, is right alongside us for this hard and holy work. We should never, however, fail to understand that he will leave us to go and find the one who is lost, who is terrorized, who is left out. Perhaps when that happens, rather than standing there feeling left behind, we should join his search party!

When it Rains Inside

As all homeowners know, there is always something inside or outside our homes that needs attention. And things break. On Saturday, May 30th, just after 6:00 am, that happened at Centre Church. Our building suffered under a torrent of water from a failed sprinkler head high up in the attic above the balcony and sanctuary. As good fortune would have it, Chuck Cotting was on his way by as the fire department arrived on scene to attend to the sprinkler system alarms. Once the source was located, mitigation began. Thank you to Chuck, Scott, Bruce, and Jeff for handling the details and arranging for the assessments and getting started on remediation and reconstruction. We give thanks to God that we are already sharing worship in another "space" as we attend to this mess.

The water cascaded down through the attic's insulation into the Sanctuary and Balcony, soaking ceilings, walls and floors, into Richards Hall and the closet to form Lake Richards.

This is now a very large insurance claim. Centre Church retained a Public Adjuster, Matt Alphen, to represent the Church. This was much too large and complex a claim to be handled only by our volunteers, most of whom who work full time.

Chuck is working with Matt Alphen to line up all the contractors needed to complete our reconstruction project – painters, contractors, commercial kitchen firms, plumbers, electricians, flooring companies. The largest projects involve all of the flooring in the sanctuary, narthex, Richards Hall and the kitchen, as well as the ceiling in Richards Hall. In addition, the evaluation and repair of the sprinkler system is ongoing as we seek to make sure there are no repeat performances! Throughout this situation, we continue to ask ourselves, "What blessings can be found in and among this tragedy?" The Spirit of the Living God will most certainly be blowing through this church and her people amidst this tragedy, just as certainly the dehumidifiers and fans are drying and blowing the air inside our building. We must keep our ears, eyes, and hearts, open for what God would have us do in order to continue living the love of Christ in the world and for the world and how our building serves that mission!
