Finding God in the Emptiness

Apprehend God in all things, For God is in all things. Every single creature is full of God. ***********

All hiding places reveal God. If you want to escape God, God just runs into your lap.

For,

God is at home. It is we who have gone out for a walk. - Meister Eckhardt

As I reflected in worship this past Sunday. pandemic living had me feeling pretty empty on Saturday. It felt, if I'm being honest, a lot like that hollow feeling you get in your tummy when you're really hungry. I was feeling completely poured out - no joy left. But, what I have discovered through 57 years of living is that rushing to fill the emptiness – whether in my growling stomach or in my soul – is never a good idea! When I rush to eat "all the things" because I'm so hungry, I invariably end up with a stomachache. I actually feel much better when I slow down, let some of the ache pass, choose one thing that will satisfy and eat it slowly. When it comes to spiritual emptiness, I've discovered it's even more important to wait, because the emptiness is an illusion; something that 13th century German theologian and mystic Meister Eckhardt knew as well. Every single creature is full of God. Even me. God is even in the emptiness. Even when we try to flee from God, God just runs into our laps [insert feeling] of a dog on your lap here]. So, when that hollow

empty feeling comes, I wait. I wait in silence. I wait in rest. And I listen. Because God is in the emptiness, waiting, too! Waiting for us to sit still and silent long enough to hear what God needs us to know, to do, to be, to live.

This past weekend was a threshold weekend for Centre Church. The remediation work is done and the reconstruction ready to begin. But for the weekend, so much hollow, empty space. A rare moment in our 300-year history when multiple spaces within our current structure are stripped back to their bones. Over the next month(s), those empty space will be filled again with the things needed to make them functional, and yet still, they will be empty of our presence in person for worship, fellowship, faith formation, mission. While that is so, I hope we can all linger in the uneasiness and vulnerability of the emptiness and silence and listen. I hope we can dwell for a while in possibility. Rather than wishing for what was, I pray we can live in the hope of what can be. Not a single one of us is excluded from sharing God's imagination. Oh, we can try to hide. We can pretend it's not "our thing," that praying, mystical, spiritual transformation thing. We can try to leave it to others and just go on making our own way in this crazy time. But God is still right with us, in us, and hoping to act through us. God is still at home at Centre Church. God is still at home in each one of us. What might God be hoping to do with us, after the flood?
