MOVEMENT

The biweekly Christian journal, *The Christian Century*, features The Buechner Narrative Writing Project which honors the life and legacy of writer and theologian Frederick Buechner by inviting readers to submit first-person narratives on specific topics. The reflections in the October 7th edition were on the topic "Movement." As I scanned the reflections, this opening sentence caught my eye. "All my life, I have been a storyteller with my body." The first person I immediately thought of was my friend and fellow Andover Newton Theological School alum, Rev. Melody Ruffin Ward. Then I turned the page to discover . . . that she was the author!!

Melody was a professional dancer who sees dance as a "complex language of gesture that allows one the chance to experience human connection on the deepest level." Today, she approaches her ministry from that perspective, using the sensory language of the body to work with people with substance use disorders. In her reflection, Melody goes on to share about how movement allows those struggling with addiction and the trauma that is so often part of their life stories, to develop trust, rest, and hope.

Such deep wisdom! As I read that, I could feel in my own body how just how true it is. Movement can teach us so much about ourselves. Movement gets us out of our heads, into our bodies, and on a path of self-discovery. Our bodies are messengers of what ails us – and can be especially informative about when we're experiencing stress, anxiety, grief, and fear. Are you holding your breath or breathing shallowly and too rapidly? Are you clenching your jaw or grinding your teeth? Is your digestive system off or are you feeling more heartburn than normal?

I know many of you have relied on movement to cope with the intense emotions and challenges of 2020. Movement gives us an opportunity to release the tension we might be holding in our jaw, or our gut. Movement can challenge us to breathe deeper. Movement can regulate our digestion. And movement of many kinds, not just dancing, includes music which can soothe our souls. Maybe it's the birds singing on a morning stroll, or just the cadence of your feet hitting the pavement. Maybe it's a favorite album playing in your ears or on your radio as you exercise at home. Perhaps singing itself is the movement you enjoy – filling your lungs and belting out your favorite show tunes, hymns, or oldies.

Whatever comes our way in the months ahead, I can say with confidence and concern that we will be spending a lot of time indoors. I can also echo with confidence Rev. Melanie's wisdom that we embody what we wrestle with. In light of that, I encourage you to stay in tune with your body – what is it telling you about how you're really coping? And then I encourage you to find a consistent way to move your body, because when we move, we are somehow freed! Let us rely on our God-given bodies to develop trust, rest, and hope!
