On the Verge of Lent

We are on the verge of entering the Christian Season of Lent. It begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5th. Our service of Renewal of Baptism takes place in the Chapel at 7:30 pm, followed by Imposition of Ashes for those who wish it.

Many in the worldwide church attend services in the morning at which they are reminded of how our human nature is sinful. Ashes are placed on the foreheads of worshippers to remind them of our fragile and sinful natures, how if we practice our piety in order to convince others that we are religious for religious sake, we are hypocrites.

Ash Wednesday reminds us of how we need to be faithful to God in all of the places where no one notices. It reminds us to live in godly ways in order to please God first and foremost.

Ash Wednesday also serves to remind us to do a thorough self-examination of our spiritual life.

I go to my primary care physician annually for a thorough physical exam. I do so because I want to know if there are things going on inside me that I am not aware of and need to tend to. I also go to be reminded of how my daily lifestyle affects my well-being. My doctor talks with me about what I need to do in order to be healthier (you know, lose weight and lower my cholesterol!)

A good physical by our primary care physician is one good way to begin Lent.

A good spiritual examination is also a good way to begin Lent.

What about it? Do you profess to love your neighbor, and then curse someone with whom you live and/or work, under your breath?

Do you say that you talk with that relative you say you love on a regular basis but, in fact, do not, except when they call you?

Do you like to sing, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," but treat him like a stranger when he calls you to a position of responsibility and leadership in his church, or when he gives you the opportunity to help a stranger, a neighbor, or a friend?

Jesus has given his all for us. What do we give to Jesus? Do we give our all, or just a little of our spare time or our spare change, and then, do so reluctantly?

Early on in my life, while I was busy trying to make the grade in college, I continued to drive the hour home on weekends in order to teach 5th and 6th grade Sunday School. It was not easy to prepare and teach the class, while trying to keep up with my college work. I felt, though, that I had to maintain my dedication to serve the Lord even when it was not easy. It was a very rewarding experience and kept me in touch with the people of God in my church who gave me my faith. I attended worship and taught Sunday School every week while in college, no matter how convenient or inconvenient it was for me.

It was a time in my life when I was welcoming of God's word and presence in my life, especially as I was beginning to feel that God was calling me to service in the Christian Ministry. I now know, that if had not maintained my dedication during that time in my life, consistently listening to God's word, giving myself to teaching children about Jesus, I would have likely missed the greatest opportunity of my life, to be ordained a minister and to meet and serve with the wonderful and loving people of the three churches and communities where I have been called to serve.

So, I ask you, how and where is God calling you? How will your increased discipleship and service to God bless you, but also, through you, many others?

In this Lent, I pray that you will devote yourself to a closer walk with Jesus Christ, and, therefore, perhaps find the greatest opportunity of your life, and experience the greatest fulfillment of your life.

You might start by asking yourself, "What are the important things in my life?"

Watching TV

Playing video games

School Work

And where, in that list, is the practice of your faith? Does it even make the list?

The Prophet Joel in the Old Testament offers challenging words for Lent: He urges us to return to the Lord. He urges us to not simply serve the Lord with our outward appearances, but with our hearts. Let our hearts break for the Lord where his heart breaks for people in the world. (see Joel 2)

In everything you do, remember the God who is your creator and considers you unique and special, knows your name, your every thought, your history, your present, and your future. May you give yourself to that future. May we all.
