Dear Friends.

In a recent sermon I lifted up two film examples of revival-style evangelists: Steve Martin as Jonas Nightengale (yes, that's how he spelled it!) in "Leap of Faith," and Robert Duvall as Sonny/The Apostle E.F. in "The Apostle." Each had a style very different from that shared by most "mainline" Protestants, and each was deeply flawed in his personal life, but in both lives the Good News itself shone through in spite of the false fronts and failings.

Each of us has the capacity to reveal whatever part of God's Good News of love, challenge, comfort, disturbance, judgment, and grace has been and is active in us. Each of us has the capacity for witness, for testimony, from our own stories.

Before you dismiss this letter as "really going off the rails for a mainline liberal New England preacher," let me say that testimony, witness, is simply telling part of your story. Yours and no one else's. The story, experience, reflection unique to you.

In a conversation after worship that Sunday there was offered the lovely phrase: "the God of your heart." Instead of worrying about "proper" or "orthodox" phrasing and sufficiently intellectual content, how about asking yourself: Who is the God of my heart?

This is not a sentimental question nor does it dismiss the need to engage questions of faith and experience with one's mind as well as with one's heart. It is a kind of personal inventory: in what relationship or experience have I encountered God? To whom (beyond my partner, spouse, best friend, mentor) have I at some time given my ultimate trust, entrusted my hopes, doubts, dilemmas?

At its best, church – a congregation – is a community in which the sharing of personal faith stories, experiences of God, affirmations, doubts, questions is not merely allowed or tolerated but welcomed – from any age person. Testimony from one's personal journey is not used to coerce others into one's own beliefs – nor is it a target for judgment by others. It is simply offered as "here is a light that illuminates part of my journey; you may find it helpful as well – or at least come to know me better."
