Dear Friends,

This fall begins an exciting new year of programming at Centre Church. Our church has long supported Heifer International and its efforts to make an impact on ending hunger and poverty. In the 1960's, the Rev. Andy Richards not only encouraged the congregation to support Heifer with monetary donations, he himself traveled several times with Heifer to deliver animals to countries around the world. Some members of our congregation volunteered in these efforts as well. We have put a little display of old newspaper clippings on the bulletin board outside the library for those who are interested.

You will see that we proudly display fourteen ARK awards in the Narthex. Each of these represents a donation of \$5,000.00. We would like to add #15 by the end of this year. The focus in 2014-15 for both Christian Education and Youth Ministry will be centered on Heifer International. Our Church School will continue offering Rotation Sensation and we will be using the rotation curriculum "Feeding 5000" offered by Heifer. The lessons are designed to make a connection between scripture, Heifer's Cornerstones for Just and Sustainable Development, and the animals in Heifer's menagerie.

On Sunday, October 5, we will plan a whole church visit out to the Heifer Farm in Rutland, MA and enjoy their Global Harvest Festival. There will be activities for all ages and the opportunity to visit with the animals, explore the Global Village and learn more about Heifer. Later in October, both the Middle School and High School youth groups will

participate in an overnight experience staying in the Global Village. We are also hoping to plan a week long Alternative Spring Break for our youth to the Heifer Ranch in Arkansas in April.

This year, we hope to help the children, youth and adults of Centre Church see themselves as part of the global family and gain a deeper appreciation of the ways in which Heifer helps people, animals and plants live in harmony as God's good creation.
