Change, from the Ground Up!

One of my sabbatical projects was laying down about 20 Patio blocks, 25 lbs. each, to elevate my nice, new Weber Grill off the ground so that dirt would not splash up onto it when it rained. This was an area about 5 feet by 6 feet square.

How much experience did I have doing this? Very little. I had laid down 6 such patio blocks a year ago at the base of a set of stairs where the ground was relatively level. But now, this area was not level, and, some of the patio blocks would have to be cut.

So, first, I worked to level the ground, digging, shoveling, raking, filling, and using a level. Next, I went to the home improvement store and found the patio blocks I wanted, along with the patio block sand. I asked the Pro person at the home improvement store, "How do you cut patio blocks?" The Pro person explained that I could use my electric skill saw with a special masonry blade to cut the blocks. My Centre Church Pro person, Scott, told me to run water over the cutting area to keep the blade from overheating.

With all of this new knowledge, materials, and tools, I went to work, on my knees, to lay out the blocks, first, on the bare ground, to get each one precisely level with the neighboring blocks. This is very time consuming, requiring each block to be laid and lifted at least 20 times, till it is level. Then, I lifted all of the blocks out, and put down the patio block sand, and, again, one by one, placed them back in place, lifting and leveling over and over.

My neighbors watched and ached, on my behalf, not daring to come out to talk to me about the project till it was finished because I was working so hard. Sweat, dirt, back pain, and frustration, were all part of the job.

Once all of the uncut blocks were in place, I started the step of cutting blocks to fit the area adjacent to the building. Wearing ear and eye protection, and being assisted by a friend, I successfully cut the first three blocks. They fit! Amazing. A few days later I cut the remaining 4 blocks to size and again, they fit. A last minute adjustment in the layout design prevented me from making the mistake of cutting several blocks to the wrong size. Phew!

Completed: a four day project, spread over 3 weeks, over 20 blocks now in place. Now, my neighbors came out and admired my work. "You work hard," they said. "Work hard, play hard," I responded.

Now, my cherished grill will suffer less disgrace, and can be easily moved around as needed.

I enjoyed the solitary nature of this project, doing it alone, at my own pace. While there were others around, seldom did anyone speak to me or interrupt me. (Perhaps they were afraid I would ask them to help! I know that some of my neighbors thought I was crazy, working so hard while on vacation.)

I was able to reclaim and remember a part of my childhood, growing up on a farm where we all, my father, mother, and brother, worked hard most every day, except on Sundays when we honored the Sabbath, attending church, visiting and relaxing with family and friends, which often included playing hard.

The Lord's work is not easy, and is often found in places of solitude. Like laying patio blocks, it requires determination and perseverance. It requires us to try new things, step back and reflect, ask for advice and input, make further changes, as needed, and keep at it. And yes, there are times when we must start over. Fortunately, I did not need to start over, but did need to lift all of the blocks at one point and make the layout a bit larger, purchase a few additional blocks to make the project look a lot better.

What we accomplish for God will be and is extremely rewarding. We will change the ground we walk on, the lives of others, but, mostly, I believe, ourselves. We will grow stronger and more confident in our abilities to serve the Lord. We will grow more confident that we can do a lot more than we ever imagined, if we keep at.

Forty-eight years ago when I graduated from High School, I had no thoughts of a vocation in Christian ministry. There were many times when I found myself on my knees in prayer, asking God to help me lay out a new design for my life and work. There were some who recommended an easier path but the one the Lord gave to me has proven to be the right one, the most rewarding one, but, surely, not the easiest path.

God is faithful if we labor to do and complete the work God has given to us. Let's humble ourselves in prayer, work hard, persevere, and find great rewards therein.


Beer and Wine Tasting Saturday, November 1, 2014 6-9:00 pm


