Community

I want to tell you about the experience of Community I had this past week.

It started when I received a call, this past Thursday, that parishioner *Betty Jane Hayter* had been taken to the hospital with a possible stroke. After some time at the hospital the doctors confirmed the very sad and tragic news that Betty would likely, not recover.

I was privileged to witness the amazing community of Betty's loving family gather to her, of their love for her, sharing their love and stories with each other, and giving each other comfort.

Betty was moved to a Hospice where we spent her last hours with her. We honored her for the amazing woman she was, serving our country in the Navy in World War II, marrying her late husband, Charles, giving life and love to her family, generously giving of herself to Centre Congregational Church, to the Town of Lynnfield, to the Schools, to the Council on Aging, etc. Betty, surrounded by her loving family, died peacefully Sunday, around 8 am.

My experience of Community continued as we gathered for worship on Sunday to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism for *Robert Otis Andrews*, whose father, Peter, grew up in Lynnfield, attending Centre Congregational Church. Peter, and his wife, Kristen, and their families, along with our congregation recognized, in Baptism, the unconditional love of God, and how, Robert Otis, like all of us, is a unique and beautiful child of God. Robert Otis' father, Peter, tells me how Centre Church was a great place to grow up and learn and know the love of God, and he hopes the same for his son.

And then, during the worship service, my/our experience of Community came full circle as we heard testimonies of service from two members of Centre Church, friends from their days in Kindergarten, *Devon Abt and Jacqueline Popoloski*. Devon was baptized and confirmed at Centre Church. She recruited her friend, Jackie, to Centre Church, who was also confirmed here. They graduated from Lynnfield High School together in 2008. After High School they went to college, Devon to Colorado State University, and Jacqueline to Suffolk University, both graduating in 2012.

Upon graduation Devon joined the Peace Corps, serving as a Rural Community Health Volunteer in a small Muslim village in The Republic of Benin, West Africa. Her role was to implement the National Protocol for Malnutrition Recuperation, as outline by UNICEF and USAID, and assist in carrying out vaccinations, prenatal consultations and other maternal and child health initiatives at the local clinic. Living amongst the poorest of the poor, with no electricity, struggling daily to find food, clean water, and stay healthy (Devon contracted both Typhoid Fever and Malaria) for over two years, she says she learned a lot about the developing world and the

challenges they face. She is currently applying to medical school and hopes to pursue a career in international development and global health.

Since 2009, Jacqueline has served the world's poor in Nicaragua, Central America with FNE International, a non-profit based in Boston. (www.fneinternational.org) FNE promotes education and sustainable development projects world-wide, particularly in Nicaragua, the second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Many families live in houses made of scrap cardboard, metals and plastic with dirt floors and lack access to clean drinking water, proper sanitation practices, and quality education and healthcare.

Jackie has been involved with FNE in Nicaragua with a number of projects including a clean water initiative, scholarship program, building of homes, eco-latrines, stoves, and a new solar-powered library. She also has spent time in special needs and English classrooms supporting teachers and working one-on-one with students.

During her multiple trips to Nicaragua, Jackie says she has learned a lot about working with impoverished communities and believes that education is the key to making successful and sustainable changes in the developing world. She currently works for a non-profit in East Boston where she is the director of an ESOL Program and teaches English as a second language. She also is currently pursuing a Masters of Education degree at Salem State University and has plans to return to Nicaragua again in June 2015.

What struck me was how both Devon and Jackie's faces beamed with joy as they spoke of about their work in Benin and Nicaragua. They also spoke of how Centre Congregational Church taught them, in large part, to give themselves to others, especially to the poorest of the poor in the world.

I am aware of how *Communities in Christ change lives forever*. Devon and Jackie have been changed and are changing the lives of others every day, for the sake of Christ's love. They changed our lives yesterday, as they spoke and inspired us to do likewise. In fact, it is clear, their greatest joy is experienced when they are serving God's people in Benin, West Africa and in Nicaragua, Central America.

As they spoke, I was reminded of the times I would visit with Betty Jane Hayter, and hear her speak of her life, of her service and her joy in giving herself to others. She, too, was never happier than when she was taking care of her family, serving at the church, working in "Betty's Kitchen" at the Lynnfield Senior Center, and doing something to be of service to another. She didn't wait to be asked, either. She just saw a need and acted from her heart.

Community: Betty so wanted to be in church yesterday to see Robert Otis Andrews baptized because she knew his grandmother Janet, and his father. She was looking forward to hearing Devon and Jackie speak, because she has known them and their families for years. I feel that her spirit was clearly present in so many ways. Betty Hayter, Devon Abt, and Jacqueline Popoloski have fulfilled and are fulfilling the call in their baptisms to discipleship. We extended a new baptismal call to Robert Otis Andrews. I pray he fulfills his call to discipleship, also. And, yesterday, Devon and Jacqueline challenged us to continue to fulfill ours, finding our greatest joy in serving others.

Communities in Christ change lives forever!
