Community Is Where We Make It

In my last *Tower Notes* article I wrote about community, how "Communities in Christ Change Lives."

I keep thinking about Community, as I learn from parishioners, in particular, how their lives were shaped by the people and places they grew up in and with. I realize that it doesn't seem to matter where we are. Caring and loving communities can be created anywhere, under almost any circumstances.

Last month I wrote about Devon Abt and Jacqueline Popoloski. They told us stories about how they found such caring and loving communities in Benin, West Africa and Nicaragua, respectively, even among the poorest of the poor.

I grew up in a rural community where farming was a way of life. I knew most everyone I met every day, every week, and every month. We were mostly all of the same background and of the same belief system, reformed Protestants. I always felt safe, loved, and cared for.

After college I made a big change. I moved to New England for graduate school, living in Newton, MA, where I knew absolutely no one prior to my arrival. Yes, I was scared and homesick. I thought about going back home. But, I stayed and soon found myself living in another, a different kind of caring community. I was challenged to learn and grow in new ways that were often hard for me. In every place I lived and worked I felt the presence of God in many ways, watching over me.

This has continued to be true for me, in all the places I have lived and worked. I realize that a large part of this has to do with the way I am outgoing and an extrovert. I feel that it also has to do with the way other people are - desiring and needing to find communities where they can connect, make friends, feel safe, and find comfort.

In 1997 when I bicycled across the country, I also found caring communities in almost every place I stopped, for a night or for a couple of nights. During my short stays we shared stories and experiences through which we quickly connected, mostly as a result of our religious faith and traditions.

How do we establish a caring and loving community of faith? Jesus laid the groundwork with these words, "*I give you a new commandment, that you love one another*. Just as I have loved you, you should love one another." (John 13:34-35)

I know people who commute to work every day on trains and buses who have found such caring communities among their fellow travelers, and, in at least one case, the conductors. Years ago I became

Boston. His name was *J. P. (Jay) Marsden*. What a character!!! He was Santa Claus incarnated. And yes, you guessed it, once a year, he dressed up and played the part on his train. He would come up with all kinds of ways of getting on the intercom to bring fun and joy to his commuters. He set a loving and caring tone on that train that enabled everyone else to open up, go beyond the isolation of their book, newspaper, and/or computer, and to start to talk with one another. Tom Long, of the *Boston Globe*, wrote an article about him in March 16, 1993.

Jay, one person, made a difference and proved that people everywhere are looking for an opportunity for a loving and caring community. Every day, during a 52 mile, 90 minute commute, Jay turned 600 grumpy passengers into a lively, happy, bunch of friends (well, most of them!)

This is a large part of our calling as spiritual pilgrims in Christ, to make a loving and caring community wherever we find ourselves. We are called to live God's love out for everyone, and to live with a generous and grateful heart.

Every time we gather on Sundays, I invite you to show your love for the people we gather with for worship. Introduce yourself to someone you do not know and ask them where they are from, what they do, who they came with, and start to strengthen our community of faith. I find all of you interesting and loving. While not everyone is a Jay Marsden on the Lowell line, we all need community.

A community of caring and love is the deepest form of God's Spirit at work. Let's give that gift to each other.
