Estuary

"God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good." (Genesis 1:10. NRSV)

Many of us are drawn to the shore where the ocean meets the land. Artists sit and paint beautiful and countless scenes of such places.

The ocean is a dynamic place to be. It is always actively interacting with us, as if playing with us. It's waves push us, carry us, speak to us, and retreat to come again and again. While all of the earth is constantly changing, it's a lot easier to see the changing nature of the ocean given its churning waves. You can walk a beach every day and each day see a different scene because the oceans are always changing it, re-forming it.

The ocean is also a place where fresh water meets the salt water, creating unique places of life called estuaries, the nursery grounds for crustaceans, mollusks, and fish. The influx of seawater and the outflow of fresh water once or twice a day, determine the types of organisms that live there. These organisms have developed specialized ways of adapting to their changing environments. It is a fragile balance.

As we know, the place where the ocean meets the earth is an exciting place, but it can also be a dangerous place, when powerful storms make for ferocious waves, winds, and currents.

As I think of this, I also think about life in the church. The community of the church is also a place where there is constant change, a place where people from different backgrounds, experiences, and places are coming together. Some of us are early in our lives, some of us are in mid-life, and others of us are

late in life. Some of us have grown up in town or the community of the church, but most of us come from other places. We come to the church with different needs, agendas, desires, ideas, and expectations.

Like where the ocean meets the land, the church can be a type of "estuary," where the influx of differences make for a beautiful place where a new community is created as we adapt to each other. It can also be a fragile place as we wonder if our differences will provide for our spiritual nurture and growth. In fact, church communities can be dangerous places if our differences are allowed to divide us, and if our egos prevent us from adapting.

As I ponder the above text from Genesis, I feel that it is God's way to "gather" us together from our different places and through our different personalities and to create something that is good, and unique. Like you, I struggle when the important things to which I have grown accustomed change and challenge me in new ways. And yet, that is the nature of all of life.

In Jesus I see someone who turned no one away, and welcomed everyone who wanted to walk with him.

I ask you to pray with me that we will find joy, excitement and rewards in our new ways of ministry this year. I ask that we be patient with one another and that we encourage one another. I ask that we remind ourselves that as God brings the ocean to meet the land, God has also brought us together to meet and know each other, and that God calls it good.
