For Everything

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, NRSV)

What is changing in your life?

There are things that change over which we have no control: Our parents, where we were born, our age, the price of fuel, the weather...

There are things that we can change: our lifestyle, the food we eat, the speed at which we drive, how much sleep we get, what we say, the decisions we make, where we shop, how much we serve the Lord.

Growing up I went through some of the seasons mentioned in the above scripture verse, birth, death, planting, harvesting, weeping, laughing, mourning. I tried to dance, from time to time. We threw stones away from the fields so that they didn't break the farm equipment. I learned the importance of hugging my family. I cherish those hugs now that most of those family members are gone.

Watching my mother, I learned how to do simple sewing of some of my clothing. I tried to learn

when to keep silent. Knowing when to speak, especially on behalf of another, is something I still struggle with.

Some of the hardest changes that parents face are the changing seasons of their children. Early on it may seem easy to see the changes our children go through: the first step, the first tooth, the first word. Early on we pay attention to every change they go through. But, before we know it, they are starting to go off on their own, changing in ways and places we are not always first to see, sometimes not even aware of.

One of the hardest changes that we go through is the loss of a parent, a spouse, or even worse, a child. Such a season is one we would like to avoid. After the death of my father when I was 16, I felt like I had no control over the changes in my life. I felt like I was free-falling through space, unable to grab hold of anything close to stability. It was not a comfortable feeling. I felt fear because I did not know where I was going or how I was going to get there.

Some of the nicest changes of seasons in our lives can include marriage, children, graduations, new jobs, new home, new friends.

What helps us through these changes? The most helpful things for me have been my faith, my family, my best friend, and friends, friends who believed in me even when I had doubts about myself.

The most important thing for us to remember that is that God is our constant companion through all of the seasons of our lives. God is the source of our being, the author of our lives. God breathes the Spirit into us at the time of our birth, and is always there to help us maintain that Spirit in and through us throughout our lives, even into the last change of season in this life. As Jesus said, "I am with you always, even unto to the end of the world." (Matthew 28:20).

I fear that we often fail to turn to God during the changes in our lives, especially the good changes. Turning to God to give thanks in the good times is especially important so that we give ourselves the opportunity to ask God's guidance in the use of the blessings we have, instead of taking them for granted. God is always there for us when the changes are difficult and we find it easier to seek God out in these times

I pray that for every season we are in touch with God's desires, comfort, wisdom, and presence. God may be seeking us out in order to help bring changes in us, in others, in our communities, and in our world that will bring a new season of blessing: peace, healing, justice, and respect. God may also be seeking us out to bring a season of change that will be hard for people to accept, but one that, in God's eyes, is needed for the benefit of all, but especially for the least of these, where Jesus has often been known to be found.

Donations by direct debit to your checking account incur minimal (ACH) fees, but credit card transactions incur higher ("merchant") fees through the credit card companies. But please do take advantage of this new capability.
