Advent = Preparation

The preparations are officially underway! We had our annual Advent Workshop last evening at Centre Church: We celebrated by making Advent crafts and the making of our own Christmas wreaths. It is always fun to have fresh greens so that we can attempt to make our own wreaths.

What does it take to make your own Christmas wreath? It takes greens, metal rings, green florist wire, shrubbery clippers, red ribbon, work, and a willingness to risk doing something you are not accustomed to doing! It also takes someone with a little bit of knowledge and experience to show you how to get started. (that's where I come in, thanks to the late Herbert Enos, who once lived in Jamaica Plain and was a member of First Baptist Church, Jamaica Plain, who showed me how.) And, it takes a willingness to get your hands dirty from the tree sap and sometimes, cuts on your fingers from the florist wire.

Like people, every wreath comes out different, some lopsided, some uneven, some looking pretty good, and some, great! I only do this once a year so every year, my wreath comes out different.

The best part for me, is that we all leave with a great deal of satisfaction, having made our own wreath. I leave with the satisfaction of how we worked together, learning and sharing with each other in a very unique Advent activity, all brought about, of course, through our ties in our Church.

This is how we make Advent! We do it together, sharing the traditions, songs, scriptures, and meanings of Advent so that by the time Christmas arrives we have a greater and deeper understanding of what it really means to prepare for the birth of Jesus.

As we light the four candles of Advent over the course of four weeks, I am reminded of those many others who have helped us prepare. I think of John the Baptist who reminds us to prepare the way through returning our hearts, minds, and souls to God for renewal so that we are open to the gift God brings. I think of the humble shepherds, filled with wonder, the heavenly hosts or angels who announced to Mary that she would bear a son, Jesus, and those who sang of it to the shepherds. I think of the prophets who helped keep hope alive that a Messiah would be born, Savior of the world, when many others doubted and laughed at the thought.

Now it is our turn, to keep hope alive, to tell the story, to turn our hearts, minds, bodies, and souls back to God so that we help the world prepare

I am thinking of those who are battling a chronic illness. Lest we forget, these cherished ones, they need us to keep hope alive, to keep telling the story of a God who does not desert us, who keeps loving us no matter what.

I invite you to join with me, in our preparations, via Night in Bethlehem this coming Saturday, December 5th, 3 to 6 pm, our Advent worship services, especially for the Lighting of the candles on the Advent Wreath each Sunday, for a Baptism on Sunday, December 13th, for our Christmas Pageant, Sunday, December 20th, for our Choir's Christmas Concert, also, December 20th, and for our Christmas Eve Candlelight Services, 5 pm and 11 pm.

Together, we prepare the way for the coming of our Lord! Together, we proclaim the good news. Together we are the church, the Body of Christ. And, together we serve to bear the light of Christ Jesus.
