Dear friends,

I've so enjoyed getting to know you over coffee, tea, lunch, dinner, meetings, and events in February and March. I realize that we haven't all had the opportunity to sit down and visit, so I wanted to take this opportunity to let you know a little more about me.

I'm the eldest of five children. My parents were both college professors, but my mom left teaching to raise the family. I became interested in drama as a preschooler when I was chosen for the lead in "Goldilocks". (Interestingly, I've always been a brunette!) I attended Bates College and then Emerson College where I received my undergrad degree in Communication with a minor in Theatre Arts. I'm a member of Screen Actors' Guild.

I grew up in Maine, came to Boston to go to college, made some dear friends and stayed. While in seminary, I realized that if I were truly going to encourage people to "live their dreams" or do things they found difficult, I would have to practice what I preach. That led me to move to Los Angeles for a few years. I always wanted to live there, but hadn't made the move. Summer is my season, so it was truly a dream come true to live where it's summer year round! My father's failing health led me to move back to New England.

A few folks have asked about my call to ministry and, given my Greek heritage, how I wound up in the United Church of Christ. I grew up in the Greek Orthodox Church, where most of the service was conducted in Greek. I don't speak Greek and there was a real disconnect between the God I knew in my heart and the one I couldn't seem to get close to in church.

After several years of not attending church at all, I found my attention drawn in by a 'wayside pulpit' in front of the church. I forget the exact quote on it, but it resonated with me and I went in to check it out. After about a year of going to church, I visited a friend's church. It was there that I saw the minister and thought, "I could do that." Immediately, my second thought was, "No I can't! I'm not holy enough!" But the feeling persisted.

Over the next several months, the Holy Spirit nudged me time and time again to check out seminary. I finally decided to take one class. Then I took two. Then I was hooked. Over my years in seminary, I studied at Andover Newton Theological School, Claremont School of Theology, Gordon Conwell Seminary, and Pacific School of Religion. I earned my Master of Divinity and graduated with honors. During that time, I found myself drawn to the UCC and the "Still Speaking" God.

Before coming to Centre Church, I worked in churches in San Dimas (California), Braintree, Scituate, and Weymouth. I truly feel humbled and blessed to be able to work for God. To me, there is nothing more satisfying than making a difference in someone's life!

They told us their own stories, and then walked us around the Boston Common area in small groups. We saw people sleeping outside, and talked about how people with no money can find what they need to survive

There were more than ninety youth and mentors from across the state attending this event. We slept on the church floor and then on Saturday morning, unpacked the donated items to display. People coming to City Reach for supplies were allotted one of each article and then, thanks to the volume of donated items, were allowed a second pass as well. This past Sunday night, members of the Wakefield/Lynnfield United Methodist Church and Rev. Glenn Mortimer, hosted a dinner and service at which a number of us spoke about our experience and discussed ways to help people who, for one unfortunate reason or another, find themselves without a home.
