We Welcome Everyone: An "Open and Affirming" Church

Dear friends,

I've been asked about the Search process, so I thought I'd outline it here. We've begun to answer the 3 Questions: Who are we? Who is our neighbor? In light of the first two questions, what is God calling us to do and be at this time and place?

What does a Search Committee do? Based on the answers to the 3 Questions, they write a local church profile that describes the church and is the basis of decisions about what type of leader is desired. Conducting a congregational survey may be part of this process. The search committee selects a chairperson, meets with the Associate Conference Minister, sets a cut-off date for receiving ministerial profiles, and keeps the congregation informed about its progress. Each member reads every profile and, together, the committee eliminates as many as possible by unanimous decision. The search team contacts those no longer under consideration and sends the full church profile to the candidates with whom they'd like to speak. Then, they conduct interviews, select the top candidate, recommend the candidate to the congregation, and work with the Conference to set up a neutral pulpit where the candidate will preach. If the congregation votes to call the candidate and the candidate accepts, the committee lets other candidates know that a pastor has been called.

What is required of Search Committee members?

Those best suited to this sacred responsibility have open minds, a commitment to Centre Church, some visionary skills, some organizational skills, the ability to keep confidentiality, and some time. Once the church profile is written, the process typically takes 3-6 months.

What can you expect if you serve on the Search Committee? You will learn about community needs and become closer to the town, church, and other members. Your heart will expand as you are Spirit-led through the process. Candidates will ask questions that will cause you to see things in new light. You will receive training and help through the process from the Conference and Rev. Estelle (who knows the process from both sides). You will feel blessed for having had the experience of helping to select your next settled pastor.

Ministry Moments

During the worship services over the next few months, various groups and committees at Centre Church will be sharing what they do. Below is a summary of what we've heard so far.

Ministry Moments – Diaconate

The Diaconate is responsible for the overall spiritual life of the church. In consultation with the Senior Pastor, the Diaconate is responsible for: Public Worship, the Music Program, Sacrament of Communion, Ushers, Flowers, Weddings, Funerals and collations. There are subcommittees that assist in performing some of these duties.

We have Ushering Teams of parishioners who help Deacons usher on Sundays. If you would be interested in ushering we would love to have you join our Ushering Team.

There are 9 Deacons and 1 Chairperson. We wear red nametags and are available to assist you or answer any questions or concerns you may have concerning the spiritual life of the church or the worship service.

Ministry Moments – Education Ministries

The main responsibilities of Education Ministries include but are not limited to the design and implementation of the weekly educational program for children; oversight of the nursery; oversight of the youth groups; confirmation class (in conjunction with the senior pastor); adult education; and the church library.

As a team, we are committed to ensuring that children and youth are provided with a warm, safe and inclusive environment where they will feel loved and respected. This is the first full year that our children in Pre-K through 4th grade have been participating in weekly sessions of Godly Play, a Montessori-based program.

We have added new programming for youth 5th through 12th grade by providing a "Breakfast Club" which met on Sunday mornings and the Giv2 Program which teams our youth with youth from other churches to participate in service activities.

We have begun brainstorming about new ideas for adult faith formation as well as Intergenerational opportunities. The church currently offers an adult Bible study every Friday morning. In addition, Rev. Estelle has begun holding mini sessions with hands-on learning activities.
