A View From the Bridge

In preparing for the memorial service for Helen Butcher, I asked my customary question of family: For what were you thankful in Helen? One of the qualities that they mentioned was that of encourager.

That definitely appeals to me. I have long felt that our world needs far more encouragers. I imagine you have noticed that the comments of "what went wrong" or "you shouldn't have done that" or "it'll never work" can arise much more readily than the words of appreciation or encouragement. We seem to take things for granted when all goes well, but when something is amiss, we are all over it in a heartbeat.

For years I have made a practice in my life of offering smiles to strangers on the street, extra thank-you comments to service people, a "how is your day going?" to a clerk or barista or teller (with a pause and a presence that lets the person know I am seriously asking the question and care about their answer), a smile and thanks for the toll-collector, a word of appreciation for someone's work or bright apparel or whatever.

People are disarmed and surprised by kindness and connection. That tells me it's even more needed than I've imagined. It takes so little of your time and effort, and it can have ripple effects that help others as well.

Try it for a day, a conscious effort to offer kindness, appreciation, encouragement wherever you go and to whomever you meet. Reflect on your experiences. You just might develop a whole new practice yourself. And you will make a difference.
