#### A View from the Bridge

One of the "incarnation" (in the flesh) gifts of pastoral caring that any of us can give through our life as a church is the visiting of those in our congregation who are hospitalized or recuperating in rehab. The following helpful ideas will be useful to you in that ministry (or in visiting a friend or acquaintance or even a family member in such settings).

If you wish visits from members of the congregation, care team, or the pastor when hospitalized, please call the church office or have a friend or family member call for you. The best way we have of learning that someone desires visits is through the individual or a family member.

If you do visit someone, <u>ask his or her permission</u> before sharing the news that he/she is hospitalized. Do not pass along any information from your visit without the person's permission. For Centre Church folks, also ask permission to share if the person would like to be remembered in prayer on Sunday and/or receive contact from the Care Team.

If you are visiting, a warm presence and a listening ear are among the best gifts you can offer. Try sitting in a chair rather than standing over the patient, so you are on a more equal level for conversation.

Short visits are best. A hospitalized person can tire very readily in twenty or even ten minutes. If you are a patient, remember that you have every right to say, "Thanks for coming. I really appreciate it. I think I need to rest now."

The focus is on the person and his or her concerns and interests, rather than the visitor's agenda. It may also be tempting to carry on a long conversation with other visitors or other people in the room, but your gift is your focus on the person you came to visit; that says that she or he is very important to you.

Whether or not you visit persons in the hospital, you can also join in support of them and their families both before and after the patient arrives home. Offer something practical and tangible, so they can tell you whether or not they need or would like to have it done for them: grocery shopping, cleaning, occasional transportation, a cooked meal.... It's easier for a person to answer a fairly specific offer rather than think up an answer to a general "Whatever you need, if it's something I can do, I'll help, and if I can't I will try to find someone who can" opens additional options.

Finally, when the person returns to church, keep your questions about their condition to a minimum — close to zero. Remember that he or she may be asked many times to retell the story, and that is truly exhausting. Asking how someone is feeling, saying how glad you are to see her or him, keeping in the present, and remembering that a person is more than a recent patient or dealing with an ongoing illness makes it easier for the person to enjoy their being with folks in church.
