#### **On Titles, Stoles, and Other Minister Stuff**

I thought I would take this opportunity, a month out from my Ordination, to explain a bit about titles, vestments, and the process through search and call from the minister's side. As I've said to my home church (First Church Nashua) folks frequently, this is a very cool thing we're doing together! They have "raised me up" as a minister, offering me opportunities for leadership as a lay leader and then as a member in discernment, and they have been support, sounding board, and discernment partners. I am so very grateful! With their support and the growth and nurture among the good people of Hancock UCC in Lexington, I have moved through the discernment process, the search process, and been called by you, the congregation of Centre Church.

In our denomination, a member in discernment who is approved for Ordination is not ordained until they are called by a church or other calling body. Since I have not yet been ordained, I do not yet use the title "Reverend." While in the UCC we do not have denominational mandates around wearing vestments or other clerical garb (robe, clerical collar, liturgical stole), our Associations' Committees on Ministry set the expectations for their churches and ministers. This is because each Association is autonomous in the UCC, just as each church is autonomous. Here in New England in the UCC, it is widely accepted that ministers do not wear stoles until they are ordained. That is why I am not yet wearing a stole with my robe during worship. But we do typically wear a robe, and are often able to wear a clerical collar. I have been wearing a robe since my first day as a student minister, and I wear a collar for public ministry or other situations where it is helpful to be known as a minister; such as at a graveside service when I would not wear a robe. I introduce myself as Pastor Nancy because it describes who I am and what I am called to do. After my ordination, my title will officially be The Reverend Nancy J. Rottman, but it will still be perfectly fine to call me Pastor Nancy or just Nancy.

That brings us to the specifics of my ordination! I will be ordained on Saturday, November 11, 2017 at 2:00 pm at First Church Nashua, 1 Concord Street, Nashua, NH 03064. Everyone from Centre Church is invited to attend! There will be members of the Search Committee that will have a part in the ordination service in the way of representing the congregation of the calling body. There will be a reception to follow. I hope that many of you will attend and participate in the joy of this significant day in my journey that is made possible by you! I will be surrounded by my family, dearest friends, my colleagues from seminary and ministry. and hopefully many of my beloved lay people from First Church, Hancock Church, and Centre Church.

No matter titles or clothing details, we have been called by God and each other into covenant. A few months after my ordination, I will be installed as your pastor. That's when we will speak the vows of covenant, joining our efforts together in mutuality toward the ministry God calls us to in the here and now. But between now and then, we will be, and have already begun this work together and I couldn't be more pleased. God's Holy Spirit is moving powerfully through this place and in and among us as we learn about each other, about God, and about the cycle of life, death, and resurrection within God's creation. I am honored and humbled to be your pastor and be called to journey with you.
