#### **Remembering the Saints**

It just dawned on me that there is a reason that I am not much of a Halloween or All Hallow's Eve enthusiast. It's because I'm more of an All Saints enthusiast. I'm sure many of you know the history of our celebration of Halloween, but I'll hit some highlights here to get us all on the same page. Halloween has its roots in the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced sow-in) which marked the end of the harvest and the beginning of winter and less daylight. People lit bonfires and wore costumes to ward off ghosts, because they believed that the ghosts of the dead returned to earth at this time when the boundary between the living and the dead became more permeable.

In the 7th century Pope Boniface IV established the Catholic feast of All Martyrs Day and Pope Gregory III broadened it to include all saints and moved the observance to November 1st. With the spread of Christianity to Celtic lands, All Saints Day was blended with the older traditions and in the year 1000, the church made November 2<sup>nd</sup> All Souls Day to honor the dead, probably trying to replace the Celtic festival of the dead. All Saints Day was also called All-Hallows or All-hallowmas, and so the night before, the traditional night of Samhain, became All-Hallows Eve, which we now call Halloween. Growing up in the Roman Catholic Church I always went to mass on All Saints Day. And while I'm sure I complained, upon reflecting now, I'm much more appreciative of the deeper rituals we

evoke in our honoring the saints in our lives than I am the whole consumer driven celebration of Halloween. Don't get me wrong. I'm not opposed to Halloween. It's just that we have few opportunities to ritualize our remembering, honor our grief, and thank God for the saints in our lives. We are too often forced to shut off our grief; close down our honoring and remembering, lest it get too morbid, scary, or dark. And in the face of that, we have All Saints Day, just when our days are getting shorter and we are worried for ourselves and our loved ones and how we'll all get through another winter full of short days and long, dark nights. Will that grief that we shut out with sunlight and summer fun resurface and choke us? It doesn't have to if we honor it. If we allow the saints of our lives to bless our living. If we bring their light into our worship of God together, recalling their goodness and giving thanks to God for all they gave us.

For some, your loss may be fresh and your journey through the valley of the shadow unfinished. Come light a candle and let the light and love of the God of new life break in. Let the love of your siblings in Christ hold you. And for those who have moved through and found the joy the holds together with sorrow, bring your joy with you and multiply the joy and light that we'll share together.

On Sunday, November 5th, everyone will have an opportunity to remember the saints of their lives in worship. We'll have candles to light and other ways for you to share the blessings they have bestowed on you. And we'll come together to be fed at Christ's table, bringing to mind all of the saints across and beyond time that are bound with us in Christ's eternal love.
