A Life of Prayer

It has been six weeks since I was called as your pastor, and in a week I am about to step over another threshold when I am ordained to Christian ministry in the United Church of Christ. These major milestones are so often the ones that compel me to my knees or to my seat in prayer, seeking silence and stillness amidst the chaos of planning and new things. I know some people find a way of prayer or a spiritual practice that sustains them always, day in and day out. Others are like me and find that they need to vary their practice because life is less than routine. And still others are still searching and seeking a way of prayer, a practice that feels good and right and holy. So, over the next few months, through Advent, Christmas, winter, and Lent, I will be offering you a variety of resources that I find especially helpful to my spiritual life and practices. Some will challenge you, some will console you, some will turn things around and teach you a new way of looking at yourself, your neighbor, or the world around you. My hope is that you will take what is useful to you and leave the rest. Spiritual practice, daily devotion, and prayer are not a "one size fits all" proposition but rather a banquet of options from which you can choose what feels right for you in this time and in this place, holding onto the truth that, at some point you might need something different. I hope that you will keep an open mind, heart, and spirit as you encounter new ideas and new ways of connecting with our God, who is our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

I'd like to begin by introducing you to the UCC Still Speaking Daily Devotional. You can find the link to sign up below and also find past devotions there. This devotion is written by a variety of UCC clergy and laypeople and it offers a reflection on a text, typically from the Revised Common Lectionary (the 3 year reading cycle of scripture) for the specific day it is written. Like all of us, some days you will find just the word you need for the day. Some days you will find something that challenges you. Some days you will not be particularly inspired at all. You will find that you prefer some writers over others as well. That's all good! We come to greater clarity for ourselves when we are in relationship with many others, some of whom we even disagree with. Whether you live with your phone in your hand or only check your email every day or two, this devotional delivers a moment to stop, breathe, and listen for a moment to what God might be saying to you today.
