Perhaps we aren't quite ready to put our burdens down, leave them by the roadside. But since we're walking together, maybe we can share our burdens and find that in doing so, we feel renewed. And if we do this in community, if we ask together, God will give us a hand called hope that will take us all the way to Bethlehem to find God with us.
