The Season of Lent

The season of Lent is a journey with a particular pace and clear destination. In Lent, we slow down and we practice being humans living in the light of the gospel as we journey toward the empty tomb, the hope and sign of eternal life. We begin this season with perhaps one of the most important and inarguable statements in all of scripture: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." It is a stark reminder of our mortality. This statement, and hearing it as ash is imposed on our foreheads in the shape of a cross, grounds us. It places our feet firmly on the earth from which we are formed as we begin our journey toward Jerusalem, toward the empty tomb and the promise of eternal life. All along the way, with our feet firmly in this earthly life, we are invited to reflect and to repent, to practice and to pray, to walk and to sit, to remember and to learn.

We will worship with ashes and Holy Communion on Ash Wednesday, February 14th at 7:00 pm in the Chapel. I hope you will leave behind any previous notions you might have about this experience and open yourself to being transformed. And then, on the following five Wednesday evenings in Lent at 7 pm you are invited to join me in the Chapel to consider together who we are and how we encounter God made flesh in Jesus the Christ. Through a 5part series on "Sensing the Gospels," we are invited to think about how Jesus makes God known to us in tangible, sensory ways: through touch, sight, taste, hearing, and smell. Beloved, I hope you will come, taste and see!


Our Church nursery is open every Sunday for infants through age 3. Experienced staff and volunteers are on hand to welcome children for story time and play.
