Bless the food before us, the family beside us, and the love between us. Amen.

Some of you may know and have prayed this grace before but it was new to me. I cannot remember where I saw it just a few months ago, but I loved it. Then I promptly lost track of it. Fast forward to early September when Mike and I were in Maine for the weekend. We stopped by a great shop called Farm + Table that Debbie and Chuck Cotting had recommended. And there, printed on a simple muslin table runner, was this grace. You better believe the pastor in me snatched that up, not only so I could finally remember the prayer, but for use in worship on a communion table someday. The connection between the communion table and the family table is powerful. In the early days of the church, when the followers of Jesus met in homes, the two tables were actually one in the same. Every time we break bread and share the cup together, we remember Jesus who gathered his friends around a table and gave them these simple gifts, the common food stuffs of bread and wine, to always remember him. In remembering Jesus in the act of eating and drinking at his table, we feel welcomed and nourished in God's saving love. But also the act of remembrance calls us to move beyond the table to feed those who are hungry; to offer clean water to those who thirst, just as Jesus did when he walked among us.

Here at Centre Church, we do just that. A lot. But we have been doing so very quietly of late. And that has me thinking we could do so much

more if we name and claim our ministries that feed our hungry neighbors. To that end, in October we will begin having a "Green Wagon Sunday" each month. We will be offering much more visible ways for you to know what "Donation Items of the Month" our Mission and Outreach ministry team have chosen and have more accessible places for you to drop them off. Then on the fourth Sunday of the month, our Green Wagon will be brought into worship by our children and we will bless what has been donated before it is delivered to Haven from Hunger or another of our mission partners. We hope that by making this ministry of feeding more visible, we will allow more of us to participate and thereby have a greater impact in our community. And in the months ahead, we will remind ourselves of the other ways that we bring the justice and shalom of Christ's table to the world around us.


