Blessed New Year, Centre Church!

By the time you read this, you will have received your "Star Words" at our worship on the Feast of the Epiphany. Each of us has the opportunity to choose a word, or more accurately, let a word choose us and then carry that word in our heart for the year. If you were unable to be with us for worship on Sunday but would like your own Star Word, please let me know and I will send you one (pastor@centre-church.org or 781-334-3050). As God would have it, choosing star words dovetails nicely with the message in the final chapter of our Advent study, Awaiting the Already (deVega, 2015). The text for this final chapter's reflection is from the Letter of Paul to Titus and deVega describes it as Paul's Christmas Letter. Here are the verses he references from Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of the Bible called *The Message*. As our study groups have discussed these verses, I believe that the contemporary language of Peterson's paraphrase helps us to quickly access the heart of these verses.

God's readiness to give and forgive is now public. Salvation's available for everyone! We're being shown how to turn our backs on a godless, indulgent life, and how to take on a God-filled, God-honoring life. This new life is starting right now, and is whetting our appetites for the glorious day when our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, appears. ~ Titus 2:11-13, The Message deVega goes on to call out the tasks of the spiritual life as Paul has outlined them here. They are, 1) to live in harmony with one's self,

2) to live in harmony with others, and 3) to live in harmony with God. "Paul reminds us that every relationship we have deserves our fullest commitment to love and reconciliation" (deVega, 2015, 86). When one of these relationships is out of balance, the others suffer as well. One of the things that occurred to me was that the simple but profound spiritual practice of gratitude can be a resource for helping us live a God-filled, God-honoring life. When we can recognize our blessings even in the midst of the most challenging moments in life, we are more likely to live in harmony with ourselves, others, and ultimately with God. So, this year, I am challenging myself to be consistent with the practice of gratitude, and seeing where in the midst of being grateful, my Star Word brings revelation or challenge, hope or help, and harmony in my relationships. Will you join me?
