Mission & Outreach

Earth Month Spring Cleaning Celebration:

Held on Saturday, April 3rd, this event was fun and successful! All activities were focused on "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle". In addition to the specifics below, a raffle prize (choice of a plant or "grabber") was given out every half hour and people who donated in any way were given a delicious and beautiful Earth cookie! (thank you Lisa Gerbick!) Joe Brown, photographer for the Weekly News, captured some of the proceedings and published a nice photo spread about it in their April 14th paper. Highlights of the event included:

*A1 Shredding Truck: collected and shredded 1.2 tons of paper which will be entirely recycled. Donations for that service covered the cost of having the truck there 9a-noon, with a \$100 surplus for <u>www.changeissimple.org</u> Missions matched that \$100, plus member donations directly to CIS, allowing us to send the early education sustainability program \$300.

*Mission of Deeds donations: A carful of small household items were collected and delivered to MOD on the following Monday. This included many boxes of kitchen supplies and 10 bags of brand new linens.

*Our **new banner** looked great displayed on the parking lot side of the church! If you haven't seen it, loop around the parking lot to check it out.

*Equal Exchange Fair Trade:_ Our "Easter" order of EE goods arrived in time for pickup at our Spring Cleaning celebration. Coffee, tea, and a variety of chocolates were available for purchase that day as well.

Matching Funds: April's matching funds totaled \$327. Recipients were Change is Simple and La Colaborativa. We've matched \$6,917 since April, 2020.
