#### **Living Within the Lines**

A few years ago, Chuck Cotting and I attended a meeting about proposed roadway improvements on Summer Street. One of my takeaways from that meeting was that when there are lane lines on a roadway, motorists drive slower and more safely. Adding lane lines on each side of Summer Street was one of many proposed ways to improve safety for motorists, bikers, pedestrians, and wildlife. Prior to that explanation, it hadn't occurred to me that motorists drive more erratically and at higher speeds on roadways that are unlined, the ambiguity of the lane allowing us to throw caution to the wind, so to speak.

That learning came into play recently in Andover. We live off Elm Street, which was paved this summer after many projects including new water and gas lines. While completing the paving project, the town also installed new ADA compliant sidewalks and crosswalks. While the sidewalks and crosswalks were being constructed there were no lane lines down either side of Elm Street. The new ADA compliant sidewalk transitions seemed to be jutting significantly out into the driving lanes. Mike and I were baffled and related to each other our discomfort and difficulty navigating through those narrowed portions of the road while fearing collision with oncoming cars. Then the project was completed, and all the lines were painted – including the lane lines down the sides of the road. And guess what? With the driving lanes clearly delineated, it was a piece of cake to drive at the speed limit, within the lane, and without any fear of oncoming traffic. Huh! Mike felt it, too. Turns out, we're just a couple of typical humans!

This experience reminded me that sometimes what is good for a few of us ends up benefitting all of us. Safer for those who are differently abled equals safer for all of us. A visual classroom schedule for a young student on the autism spectrum equals lower anxiety for all students. Common sense gun laws benefit both citizens and law enforcement alike. I

could go on and on and I'm sure you can come up with your own examples.

I believe Christ came to reawaken us to what is real and true – the divine and the human are to be held inseparably together. All of creation is sacred and we are to treat it so. We have talked about the Great Commandment as a lens through which we look at life in order to make loving decisions. I propose that believing all creation is sacred is another lens Christ offers us to help us navigate our lives in his Way. Sometimes lane lines help us all live without fear. Even if they aren't particularly for you, they certainly don't hurt you. Some rules/laws/lines help us all, or at least do no harm. Some rules/laws/lines bring harm to some. It is up to us to discern which are which, and to live accordingly, protesting and working to change those that harm, and working towards those that bring life/health/safety. And thank God we still have a voice and a land in which to live as Christ teaches us, together.
