Beloved of Centre Church,

Greetings to you in the name of Emmanuel, the One who was, who is, and who will always be, the Word made flesh who came to dwell among us.

This Advent, as we wait within the mystery for the One who came and is always coming to us, we are exploring the sacredness of all creation. Our theme this year is "Reflecting the Sacred" and I share with you that on my trip to Ireland, immersed in the Celtic spiritual tradition, I rediscovered this deeply faithful Christian knowing that every single "thing" is sacred. I am not learning it for the first time, but rather it feels like an awakening. I am recalling what I knew as a small child. My faith feels like it has burst forth from the confines of society, culture, religion, and polite company and can no longer be shoved into one specific container rather like those mattresses you order from Amazon that, once unwrapped, are never able to be packaged again.


Throughout the season I invite you to pause daily for a moment of awe and wonder. Reinvigorating our capacity for noticing, for being taken with awe and wonder, is a beginning. It is a steppingstone into the deeper truth of the paschal mystery – we are forever dying and rising with Christ. This is not something we can control or get over. And the learning and growing we do toward God happens as much or more in the dying, the descent, as it does in the rising.

Friends, I am more convinced than ever that being a community of hope depends fully on us living into these two truths. That every single thing in God's creation, including every single one of us, is sacred, and we, individually and collectively, are forever dying and rising with Christ. Witnessing to the sacred in everything and telling the truth about Christ's incarnation, death, and resurrection, is the source of our hope. And our hope is a light we shine for ourselves, our families, our neighbors, our community.

Here's to seeing with new eyes the sacred in everything! May we practice, practice, practice until it assumes its rightful place in our very nature; right where God put it in the first place.
